Dear Thiensville Residents,

There is no better place to be during the summer than Thiensville, Wisconsin. This year, make sure you attend and enjoy our wonderful Village Market, festivals and local merchants.

The major Village infrastructure project for this year is the rehabilitation/enhancement/beautification of Main Street. The project has three components. First, we are replacing broken or otherwise compromised concrete panels. Second, we are diamond grinding the entire length to make it smoother. Third, we are adding a few islands, stamped concrete walkways, periodic bump outs and some other finishing touches to spruce it up. The result will be a nearly thirty year old road that has been maintained to extend its life to improve, beautify and enhance it. The expected completion date of Phase 1 is June 24, 2016. This involves concrete repairs, landscape medians and pedestrian bump outs. Phase 2 will begin at the end of summer where landscaping, tree planting and benches will be installed. In the fall, Phase 3 will begin. During this time, streetlight pole replacements and LED light fixture retrofits will occur. No detours or major changes to traffic flow will occur during the final two Phases. Thank you for your patience. Main Street is going to look wonderful! Who knows what will happen on Main Street between now and the next time it must be maintained?

We have also established a *Village Park Reimagined!* committee led by Director of Public Works Andy LaFond and Assistant Village Administrator Colleen Landisch-Hansen to consider potential improvements to the Village Park, help prioritize the sequencing of these improvements and develop strategies to generate private and public funding to help finance them. Over the years, Thiensville's Village Park has been much improved as a result of the hard work and generosity of many individuals and groups -- such as the TMYBA, the local Lion and Rotary Clubs, the Thiensville Fire Corporation and the Junior Woman's Club of Mequon-Thiensville. We expect that tradition to continue. If you have ideas for the *Village Park Reimagined!* and would like to be involved in the effort, don't hesitate to contact Andy, Colleen or myself.

On the redevelopment front, we look forward to Port Washington State Bank building a new branch on South Main Street. We look forward to seeing what the year brings in other areas of the Village as well. If you know of businesses the Village could recruit to come here, and in particular if you have contacts inside these businesses, don't hesitate to contact me and share your ideas and contacts. We will add them to our list of businesses to cultivate via periodic calls, emails and letters. Also, as a Village resident you are probably the best salesperson for the Village. Tell your friends and acquaintances about all the opportunities here.

I look forward to seeing you out and about and wish you a fine summer.

## DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

### Garbage Collection

Containers cannot exceed 32 gallons with a maximum of 60 pounds and shall be at the roadside prior to 7:00 AM on the day of pickup. Materials shall not be placed at the roadside more than 24 hours prior to pickup.

Trees, branches or shrubs with a diameter over three inches should be cut in lengths of two feet and stacked and tied at the roadside on the day of your garbage collection. Grass clippings and leaves may be disposed of at the Public Works Yard on West Freistadt Road. Yard Gate cards are available for purchase at the Village Hall. A new card is \$20.00 and a replacement card is \$10.00.

## FOR YOUR SAFETY

We want you to be safe when out and about...For a road that has sidewalks on both sides of the road, it is acceptable to walk on the sidewalk on either side of the road (facing oncoming traffic or your back to oncoming traffic) because you are separated from the automobiles.

For a road with a sidewalk only on one side, it is recommended to use the sidewalk for traveling in either direction (with traffic or against traffic). Again the sidewalk helps separate you from the automobiles.

If no sidewalks exist on the road, it is recommended to walk facing oncoming traffic on the same side of the road as the oncoming traffic. Also, you should get as far to the side of the road as possible to provide additional space between you and oncoming cars.

When bicycling, you will want to ride on the right (going in the same direction as automobile traffic).

Also, when walking your pet, please pick up the pet waste and dispose of it properly. Please be courteous.



## OZAUKEE COUNTY NEWS

Dear Thiensvillians:

Kindly let me start this edition of updates regarding County government topics by thanking you for allowing me to serve for two more years as your representative from Thiensville. I shall do my best.

The general economic signs for Ozaukee County remain positive. We have a very substantial percentage of our people employed, and this is reflected in statistics from the County Treasurer. She reports that people are paying their property taxes at a very good rate, and we are hopeful as the summer months approach that the sales tax revenue is solid.

The Ozaukee County tax rate remains very low and reflects the frugal instincts of the supervisors and the majority of the citizens of the County. At the same time, I remain cognizant of our responsibility to maintain buildings, roads, etc. which we hope will serve the people for a long time. It is not only infrastructure that must be preserved but also services which assist our most vulnerable citizens such as the elderly, the veterans and the handicapped.

Our efforts to merge the Ozaukee and Washington Health Departments will hopefully be totally complete by mid-2016. The changes of state law, the blending of two different cultures, etc. seem to be coming together.

Michael Lappen who has very successfully directed our Human Services Department has been recruited to lead a huge department in Milwaukee County; he will be missed, but we wish him well. The Ozaukee County HHS Committee where I enjoy servings as Chair will be involved in identifying our new leader.

The effort at Lasata to update the 50-year old nursing part of the campus progresses well. As you read this newsletter, the project is 80 percent completed, ahead of schedule, and within budget. We very much look forward to getting our residents past the construction and thank them for their patience. Also, the other two campus facilities for independent and assisted living are doing very nicely.

Great work continues regarding parks, land preservation, and all issues having to do with the County's efforts to preserve the settings that make this a special place to live. I have to credit Andrew Struck who leads that department; by the way, he happens to be a Home-stead grad.

Please let me once again remind you of the wonderful services the County has for aging people. We hope they are not solely thought of as serving those with financial challenges; they are there for everyone. Do not hesitate to become acquainted with the expanded hours of the Shared Ride Taxi. Check the County website for all County information.

As I feel sure you have read in the newspapers, Ozaukee County has dealt with the problem of opiates like so many other communities. We are pleased that our first sober living setting is open and operating. While the County assisted in this development, it will be run by Starting Point, a non-profit. It has been particularly edifying to see so many County offices, the Sheriff, Prosecutor, Judges, health, human services, plus the non-profits and schools working to overcome this challenge. Even though heroin is the thing that strikes fear in us, it is important to remember that prescription drugs cause just as great a problem.

Finally, put a date on your calendar to come visit with me this fall when people are back from vacation. On September 12th, from 4:30 PM to 5:30 PM I will be at Village Hall for a listening session.

**POLICE DEPARTMENT  
FROM CHIEF SCOTT NICHOLSON**

Winter is behind us, and we all look forward to the great spring and summer season. As residents and visitors spend more time enjoying our Village, the Police Department would like to remind everyone to take precautions to ensure that no one becomes a victim of a crime.

With the spring season it brings a whole new array of scams. The newest in our community is the call about your grandson or grand-daughter away in a foreign land needing money due to a recent arrest. Please, some of our residents have fallen victim of this scam, either call your family to verify the story or call our Department immediately to assist you. Calls from people identifying themselves from the IRS are an everyday activity. If the IRS wants to talk to you, they will send a letter; they will not call on the phone. And of course identity theft is still one of the most prevalent crimes. Remember, if you are a victim, no matter where the theft occurs, contact the Police Department to file a police report. The theft may have occurred in another town, but we can still connect the investigations to bring the person to justice. If you have any questions about identity theft or tips, please give our Department a call.

**STATE LAW REQUIRES DRIVERS TO YIELD TO PEDESTRIANS:**

1. Who have started crossing an intersection or crosswalk on a walk signal or on a green light if there is no walk signal.
2. Who are crossing the road within a marked or unmarked crosswalk at an intersection where there are no traffic lights or control signals.
3. When a vehicle is crossing a sidewalk or entering an alley or driveway. In addition, drivers may not legally overtake and pass any vehicle that has stopped for pedestrians at an intersection or crosswalk.

Drivers who fail to yield the right-of-way to pedestrians who are legally crossing roadways in the Village of Thiensville may be issued citations in amounts ranging from \$98.80 - \$250.00 (depending on the violation) and 3-4 demerit points.

**DISTRACTED DRIVERS:**

***Startling Facts***

1. More than 3,000 teens die each year in crashes caused by texting while driving.
2. Texting while driving is now the leading cause of death among teenagers – surpassing drinking and driving.
3. More than 50% of teens admit to texting while driving.
4. Virginia Tech studies show drivers are 23 times more likely to be in an accident while texting.
5. 5 seconds is the minimal amount of attention that a driver who texts takes away from the road. If traveling at 55 mph, this equals driving the length of a football field without looking at the road.
6. At any one time, 9% of drivers are talking on cell phones, making them 4 times as likely to crash.
7. Talking on a cell phone while driving requires the brain to multitask—a process it cannot do safely while driving. While a growing number of drivers are turning to hands-free devices, studies show hands-free devices provide no safety benefit. The area of the brain responsible for processing moving visual information—a vital part of driving—has 37% less capacity to gather and process critical driving data and instead focuses on the cell phone conversation.
